

The Laboratory of Integrated Archaeological Visualization and Heritage (LIAVH.org) makes connections between technology, archaeological data management, and heritage practice. As the Principle Investigator of this lab, I am applying for the AIPS Senior Research Fellowship in order to conduct a remote survey of the extant walls at MohenjoDaro as a participatory workshop for local archaeologists and students. MohenjoDaro has been photographed, drawn, mapped, and written about for a century, and yet, there is still so much we cannot quite figure out about the ancient city. One of those quandaries is a stratigraphic record that can be archaeologically grounded. This project aims to utilize a vertical survey of extant walls at MohenjoDaro to more securely locate time and changes across time in a neighborhood. A key component of this research is pedagogic and participatory, specifically focused on including the local and regional archaeologists, and students of archaeology. Rather than pursuing archaeology as an extractive exercise, I hope to engender generative modes of knowledge production and sharing.
